

WHAT ARE YOUR FAVOURITE PLANTS?

For trees, the Catalpa bignonioides is a thing of awesome scale with exquisite scented flowers set among large leaves and bean-like seed pods, right. Tellima grandiflora is a flower of beauty and looks great planted in broad swathes, while the shrub Hydrangea arborescens 'Annabelle' is a true show-off with huge white globes of flowers.

WHICH GARDENS ARE IRRESISTIBLE?

We both love the scale and simplicity of the William Kent-designed garden, left, at Rousham, near Bicester. There are two distinct areas: a formal garden by the river bank, and a walled garden which is simple but lovely.



WHAT MOST INSPIRES YOU?

We were particularly inspired by the new Ben Pimlott building, left, at Goldsmiths College by architect Will Alsop, with its amazing squiggle on the roof. It shows a sense of daring and fun, and highlights the importance of creating balance through contrast.



CURRENT GARDENING PASSION?

Doing a garden for the RHS Chelsea Flower Show is all-consuming, and this year's design, above, is no exception. We run separate businesses but work together on show gardens and larger projects to help spread the load.
